School hours

School hours are the same for all groups. School starts at 8.30 h. in the morning, but from 8.20 h. pupils and their parents are welcome in the classroom. This 'walk-in' lasts until 8.30 h., then the parents leave the classroom and the pupils go (further) to work. We deliberately choose a quiet start to the morning.

The 'walk-in' is intended to ensure that pupils make a good transition from their home situation to the school situation. That is why parents and teachers are present in the classroom. This is not the right time for a conversation with the teacher, we prefer to make an appointment for that. In group 1-2 there is a play walk-in twice a week. Parents can then play in the classroom until 8:45 h.

Reporting your child sick

If your child is unable to attend school due to illness or a visit to the doctor, we request that you inform us as soon as possible and preferably before the start of lessons. You can do this by using parro and reporting the absence here. But of course you can also call the school number (0317-413029) around 8 am. If your child becomes ill during school hours, you will be notified. Therefore, always provide all current telephone numbers so that we can always reach someone.

Do not forget to report your child to the BSO

Extra school absence

Requests for leave outside the school holidays must be submitted in writing to the school principal eight weeks in advance. We advise you to consult the school principal before requesting extra leave. For more than ten days of leave, consultation with the truancy officer is required.

No important reasons for extra leave outside the school holidays include:

- no other booking options for vacation
- vacation outside the season due to lower prices
- invitation from grandparents and/or family members to go on vacation or a trip
- going on vacation earlier to avoid traffic jams



Eating and drinking during the break

As a school, we want to teach children healthy eating habits. This starts with the break. The policy regarding the break at our school is that the pupils receive a portion of vegetables or fruit (cleaned). This is eaten together in the classroom. From group 3 onwards, you can also give them a sandwich in addition to the fruit or vegetables. We also drink water at school. You can give your child a bottle, a plastic cup or a water bottle for this. At noon, the children also eat their own packed lunch. Of course, this is also healthy and cold. There is no possibility to heat up food. In groups 5 to 8 and both transition classes, a hot lunch is served on Tuesdays. This is a project in collaboration with the municipality and Wageningen University, and is provided by the cook and staff of the community center.

No sweets are eaten at school and no sweets are brought in. We see this policy as a valuable investment in the health of the pupils now and later when they are older. If there is a party, we make an exception and sometimes we do have sweets.

During breaks, the schoolyard is supervised by teachers and volunteers. In bad weather, we stay inside.

Birthdays

When a child has a birthday, it's a party! We celebrate this in the group. Birthday children are allowed to treat the class. A healthy treat is very much appreciated by the parents and teachers. The intention is that the student hands out one edible treat in the class. Bags with different types of sweets or presents may not be handed out and must be taken home again. It is advisable to discuss the choice of your treat with the teacher in advance. The birthday child may go around all classes with a large birthday card on which the teachers write congratulations. Children who turn four years old and start school do not yet treat. They also only start school the day after their 4th birthday.

Annual celebrations

At our school we have joint stage parties. The pupils present a performance in the form of dance, theatre or music to parents and pupils. These are vibrant activities. The stage parties may be attended by parents of the performing groups. Each pupil has at least one stage party per school year. Christmas, Easter, Eid-al-Fitr, Sinterklaas, King's Games and "Het Wereldfeest" are also parties that are celebrated at our school every year. This year we will also perform a musical with the entire school, around Christmas in theatre "Junushoff".

Activities contribution / School trip contribution

Money is needed to organize parties, school trips and other events. This money comes from the voluntary activities contribution that all parents pay to the school. The amount is determined each year by the MR.

The voluntary activities contribution for the 2025-2026 school year is €20 per pupil. This contribution therefore benefits your child in its entirety. At the beginning of the school year or as soon as your child starts school, you will receive a letter or a payment request to transfer this contribution. Although this is voluntary, annual parties cannot take place without these funds. That is why we are always happy and grateful that many parents simply pay this.

The school trip contribution for the 2025-2026 school year is €30. The contribution for this will be requested from you in the spring. As you read earlier in this guide: we pay the same amount every year, but once every three years we go to a place a little further away, a little more expensive, for example an amusement park. Lunch break

We work with a five equal day schedule, from 8:30 to 14:00 h.

That is why all children have lunch at school. During the teachers' break, a number of enthusiastic volunteers supervise the playground. Our mobile employees also participate in these services. We are happy to have them there: Ellen, Samira, Rita, Irina, Nour, Gerard, Aicha and Leon. On Tuesdays, a hot lunch is served in the middle and upper grades. This is prepared in the community center and is the result of a collaboration between Solidez, OBS de Wereld, Stichting Nude Toekomst, Groente & Meer and the municipality of Wageningen.

Complaints procedure

It can always happen that you as a parent are unclear about school matters.



Youth Health Care

Youth Health Care (JGZ) helps children aged 0 to 18 grow up healthily and safely. JGZ does this at the child health clinic, at school and in the neighbourhood. Each school has its own JGZ team, consisting of a doctor's assistant, a youth nurse and a youth doctor. The national speech therapy company carries out speech therapy screening in group 2 on request and with the permission of parents. This is carried out in November and May. Your child's teacher will discuss with you whether a screening is necessary. In principle, the teacher indicates who needs speech therapy screening, but you as parents can also actively request this.

Standard examinations (GGD)

Children undergo two standard examinations at primary school. These are done by the doctor's assistant around the age of 6 and around the age of 10. These examinations focus on growth and development. They also ask how your child is doing at home, at school and in their free time. You will receive a letter at home prior to the examination with a questionnaire. You can also indicate on this if you have any questions about your child's health or behaviour. Parents/guardians are not present at these examinations.

These letters and questionnaires are also available in other languages. If you wish, please ask the teacher or internal supervisor.

If there are any special circumstances or if you have any questions, you and your child will be invited to the consultation hour of the youth doctor or youth nurse. You can also make an appointment yourself if you have any questions about your child's development, health (hearing, vision, motor skills, growth), well-being or upbringing. This includes topics such as eating, sleeping, toilet training, social-emotional development and puberty (when the child is a little older).
