PLEASURE IN READING

Wordless Picture Books

Wordless picture books contain only images. Often, they are rich in detail. With these books, you can create your own story. This makes it easier to "read aloud" if your native language is not Dutch.

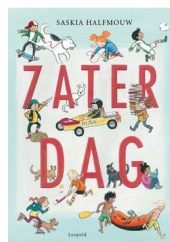
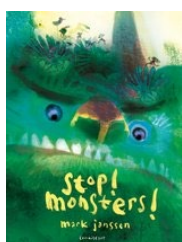
It's important to read aloud in the language you speak best.

Tips for using wordless books:

1. Let your child tell the story: Ask what they think is happening or what might happen next. This helps stimulate imagination and language development.
2. Tell the story together: Create the story as a team and build on each other's ideas.
3. Look for details: Pay close attention to the pictures and turn it into a kind of search game.
4. Invent a different ending: What else could happen? Coming up with new ideas makes it extra fun!
