Reading Aloud: From Toddler to Teen

Story time is a time to look, listen, talk, and laugh together. This doesn't stop when children learn to read by themselves. Even children in middle and upper primary grades develop their reading comprehension through being read to and discussing stories together.

In addition to improving comprehension, reading aloud positively impacts vocabulary development and spelling. It works best if you make reading aloud a daily habit, just like brushing teeth or eating together.
